Using text from the Torah, Talmud and contemporary sources, he will explore questions such as:

- ◆ What is the relationship between Jewish tradition and our stewardship of the environment?
- ◆ What can Tu B'Shvat, Purim, Pesach and Shavuot teach us about living more cheaply, ethically and happily?
